

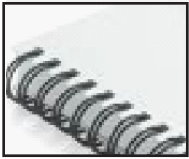
Binding options



Saddle Stitch Binding

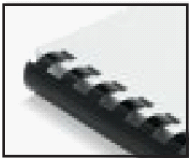
This binding is economical, simplistic, and the most popular selection for most of our booklet projects. Staples fasten the booklet along the crease of the fold, just like a newsstand magazine. This binding is easy to produce and a low cost solution.

Artwork for saddle-stitch booklets should have page counts which are divisible by 4. (8, 12, 16, 20, 24, 28, 32, ...)



Wire O Binding

Also known as Loop Binding, Double-Loop Binding, and Ring-Wire binding. This wire binding provides a professional and contemporary look for your booklet, while allowing it's pages to open a full 360 degrees. The binding is extremely durable.



Plastic Comb Binding

This binding consists of a strip of plastic running the length of the spine, with rib like plastic fingers that clasp the pages through rectangular punched holes. Pages can open to over 180 degrees and lay flat. Pages can also be added and removed without damaging the binding or the pages. Available in many colors.



Spiral Binding

This binding is plastic and is almost indestructible (cannot be crushed). Typically, writing notebooks have this type of durable binding. Available in many colors.



Ring Binder

The paper is punched by a hole puncher and inserted into the available ring binder of your choice. This type of binding is durable and helps to protect your content.



Tape Binding

Colored tape is glued to the edge of the sheets. This is a quick and cheap solution for binding. This is weakest binding as sheets may fall out after a few uses.
